Harvest Collection

The school council have been thinking about this time of harvest. Normally we collect now for the local floating shelter but unfortunately it is unable to take place this year. After a little research the school council decided that we should collect for the Purley Food Hub. Purley Food Hub was set up in January 2013 by the 12 churches of Purley & Kenley Churches Together. They help people in crisis who are without food. Their clients may have become unemployed, are suffering illness or had a sudden, unexpected change in their circumstances at home. They may have had their benefits stopped and are going through the appeal process. A series of events coming together may have left them unable to buy food for their basic needs.

Save Purley Pool Campaign

Many of you may remember a major campaign in 2015 to save Purley Pool and Leisure Centre from a threatened closure. Following this campaign by local residents, community groups, your councillors, the pool was saved and thousands of swimmers including children, the elderly, charities and community groups have benefited.

Users have recently, and understandably, complained that our Leisure Centre hasn't yet re-opened whilst four others in the Borough have. We have made enquiries and have now discovered that it's unlikely that the Pool and Leisure Centre will reopen before the end of next year - and may not re-open at all. As pupils in the juniors (and a number of our families) use the pool regularly this would be a real loss to us and therefore are campaigning for it to reopen.



Assemblies

One of the many things that is a little bit different about school life at the moment is the way in which we come together to celebrate and pray. Because of the ongoing segregation of class bubbles, there is very little opportunity for pupils across the school to interact.

To maintain a sense of community in these challenging times, we have been holding two assemblies per week via Zoom. Each class has a virtual window into each of the other classes and we get to see and hear who has been chosen for weekly awards. Aside from the odd technical glitch the system is working really well and it does go some way to make up for not being able to come together as a whole school community, for the time being at least.
