Covid Updates

Please be aware that we have positive cases of Covid in almost all classes and among both staff and pupils. There are new guidelines for schools and parents to follow (mainly regarding timescales), so please see below for further details.

Cases are rising locally and nationally so please be vigilant. Current guidance is that adults should stay at home and avoid contact with others for 5 days and children should do the same for 3 days, returning then to normal activities if they are well enough (see below).

What to do if you've tested positive for COVID-19

If you have COVID-19, you can pass on the virus to other people for up to 10 days from when your infection starts. Many people will no longer be infectious to others after 5 days.

You should:

- try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days
- avoiding meeting people at higher risk from COVID-19 for 10 days, especially if their immune system means they're at higher risk of serious illness from COVID-19, even if they've had a COVID-19 vaccine

This starts from the day after you did the test.

If a child or young person aged 18 or under tests positive for COVID-19, they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. This starts from the day after they did the test.

Children and young people tend to be infectious to others for less time than adults. If they're well and do not have a temperature after 3 days, there's a much lower risk that they'll pass on COVID-19 to others.
