

On Wednesday Year 5 were lucky enough to travel to Imperial College to take part in a Robotics STEM workshop. The children were taught how to build and code Robots to perform specific tasks. They used LEGO Mindstorm software and built upon previous learning using algorithms to code the robots to draw. I am proud to say the children showed much enthusiasm and displayed excellent behavior all day! Well done Year 5! Parking

As always, the safety of our children is absolutely paramount!
Historically, parking has always been an issue for St Aidan's.
Unfortunately, we have received several emails regarding dangerous parking which not only blocks residential driveways but also has an impact on the children being able to cross the road safely. This is a serious concern. Additionally, we are also aware of the restricted road signage due to the lack of maintenance of the trees in the open space next to our site which means that often the road signs for our school cannot be seen easily, or at all, for drivers.

We understand that it is very busy during pick-ups and drop off times especially when parking is limited. Therefore, we have asked Croydon Council to assist us in investigating this situation as a matter of urgency which they have agreed to review.

Nevertheless, we cannot stress the importance of taking due care when choosing to park across residential driveways as this has caused avoidable and unfair stress and duress for those who live opposite our school and for those who must have 24/7 access to and from their home. Therefore, it is imperative that you make a conscious effort not double park on residents driveways or stop alongside the road to drop children off.

Year 3 want to thank Dr Robert for his exciting investigations and to Danni for her help supporting the class.
























Space Dome Visit
