Cross Country

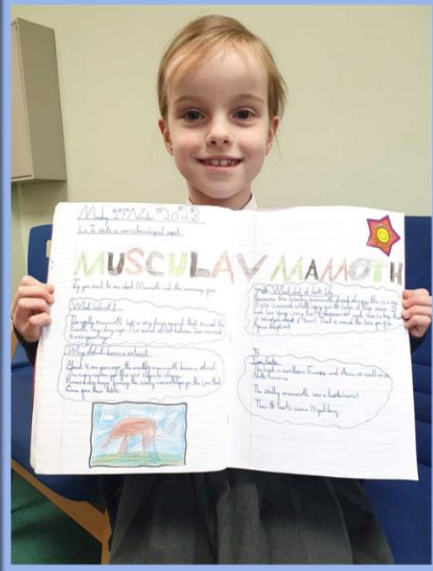
