## **Keeping Children Safe Online**

Mr Stanley has been emailing home some very useful information about online safety. Children may have received gifts for Christmas, birthdays etc., that enable them to go online. Devices such as mobile phones, laptops, tablets, game consoles are many of the items which enable children to go online and use the internet. When you gift a device that can access the internet, you're not just gifting the device itself: you're giving a portal to the entire online world. And while that includes all the fun bits, like chatting with friends and finding new favourite games, it also comes with a whole host of potential safeguarding risks.



We teach children how to be safe and we try to safeguard them against the possible dangers they may encounter in the online world. The same safeguarding principles we highlight such as crossing the road safely, using equipment, answering the front door, and other such measures should also be applied and prioritised when teaching our children about staying safe online—even the Pope tweets and our very own Fr Peter is good at using whatsapp! But we must always remain vigilant.


